We use the Leicestershire Music scheme across the whole school from EYFS to Y6. In KS2 the classes have 2 hours of music every fortnight. In KS2 the music is taught by a music specialist. In KS1 and EYFS they have an hour of music a week. The Leicestershire Music schemes covers the National Curriculum requirements We have a good selection of musical instruments available for the whole school.
