Recognise that there are special places where people go to worship, and talk about what people do there; Identify at least three objects used in worship in two religions and give a simple account of how they are used and something about what they mean; Identify a belief about worship and a belief about God, connecting these beliefs simply to a place of worship; Give examples of stories, objects, symbols and actions used in churches, mosques and/or synagogues which show what people believe; Give simple examples of how people worship at a church, mosque or synagogue; Talk about why some people like to belong to a sacred building or a community; Think, talk and ask good questions about what happens in a church, synagogue or mosque, saying what they think about these questions, giving good reasons for their ideas; Talk about what makes some places special to people, and what the difference is between religious and non-religious special places.
